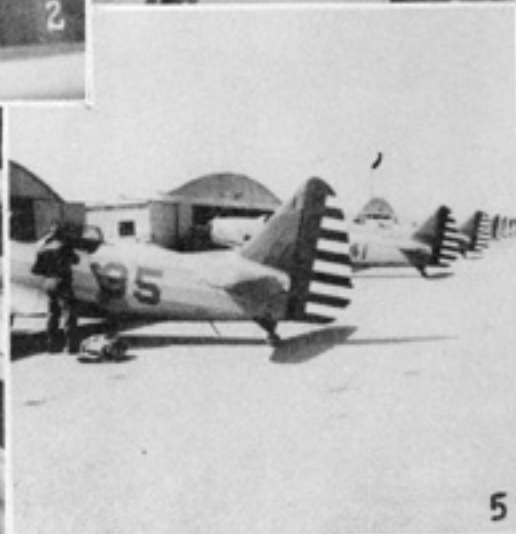
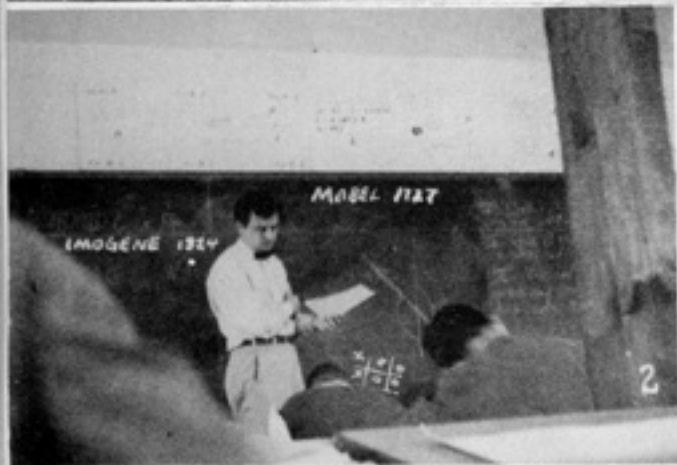
## IN OTHER FIELDS

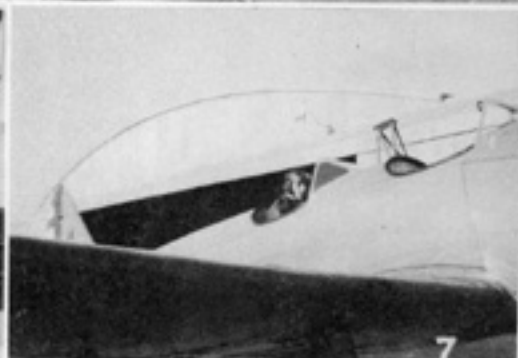
