 service in said war for the term of few months
 and was honorably discharged at
 on or about the 15th day of April
 A.D. 1815 ^{the termination of said war} in account of as well appear by the muster rolls
 of said Company. He makes this declaration for the
 purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he
 may be entitled under the act granting additional
 bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who
 have been engaged in the military service of the
 United States approved March 3rd A.D. 1855. And
 refers to his former declaration made under oath
 of September 25th 1850 and the 2nd March 1852 upon
 which he obtained a land warrant No. 4080
 acres which he having by all transferred and dis-
 posed of is not within his power to return
 He further declares that he has not received a

warrant for twenty land under any other act of
Congress nor made any application there for then
the one above referred to under act of A. 1850 & 1852
upon which he obtained the said Land Warrant
No. for 80 acres and the one now presented

Justice of the Peace duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County and State aforesaid, *Larkin Newton* aged *58* years, a resident of *the County of Ellis* in the State of *Texas* who being duly sworn according to law, declares, that he is the identical, *Larkin Newton* who was a

Seaman in the company commanded by Captain *George Barrus* in the *Second* Regiment of *Tennessee Militia* commanded by *Ed Locke* in the *war against England* commenced in *1812* was drafted and that he was mistaken in a term at

Nashville Tennessee on or about the *9th* day of *November* A. D., *1814* for the term of *5 months*

and continued in actual service in said war, for the term of *about five months* and was honorably discharged at *Murray County Tennessee* on the *14th* day of *April* A. D., *1815*

as will appear by *the records of said Regiment*; he also states *that he could not obtain his pay when discharged and would be discharged for it which discharge he does not have but has become of and he has no objection to make of it*

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which he may be entitled under the "act granting bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," passed September 28, 1850.
