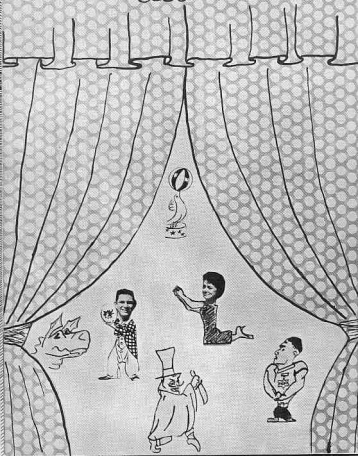




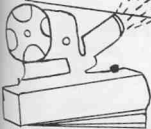

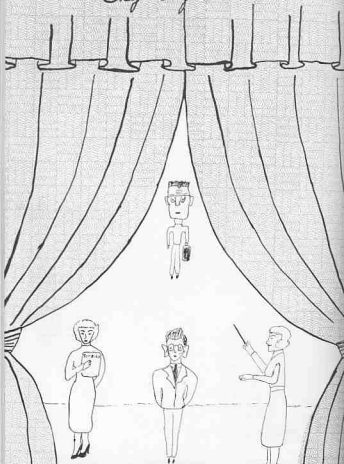

A swing band has been formed which plays for social functions.



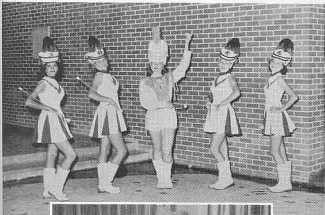
